What is St. Paul's purpose? Why do we exist?

If you were asked those questions, would you know how to answer? Last spring we collected the thoughts of a number of parishioners at a brainstorming session. This winter the Vestry took those ideas and, guided by the Spirit, came up with a brilliant mission statement for the parish. We finalized it at our last meeting. It is:

St. Paul's is a joyful faith-based community of hope and worship proclaiming the good news of Jesus Christ. We invite all to join us in spiritual nurturing and growth through ministry and service, helping create God's Kingdom on Earth.

As we discussed what qualities we felt defined who we are, who we aspire to be, and what our purpose is, these words kept coming up: "joyful, faith, community, hope, worship, Jesus, inviting all, spirit, growth, service, God's Kingdom on Earth." There were, of course, many other words we could have used and wanted to use, but as we distilled it down, these floated to the top.

St. Paul's is joyful. We love God and love each other and this is expressed in joy.

St. Paul's is faithful. The Bible says "for in Christ Jesus you are all children of God through faith." [Gal. 3:26].

St. Paul's is a community. We are not solitary individuals, but connected as the Body of Christ. Our fullest selves are found by sharing our lives together with others.

St. Paul's is a place of hope. We know that despite the challenges and evils of the world, we live in hope that through God all will be made whole.

St. Paul's worships God in song, prayer, praise, confession, gratitude, reading scripture, reciting creeds, meditation, and by sharing the bread & wine. We worship both in our

- individual lives everyday, and as a community on Sunday morning and other times.
- St. Paul's proclaims the life, death, and resurrection of Jesus Christ, through word and deed. Christ reconciled the world to God and we want to share this amazing good news with everyone.

- St. Paul's is a place of the Spirit. We honor and worship the Holy Spirit alongside God the Father and Jesus. The Spirit guides us and enables us to grow into the likeness of Christ.
- St. Paul's is a place of growth. We grow together in our spiritual lives and our relationship with God and each other.
- St. Paul's serves, loves, and ministers to our neighbors through service to the parish, the Merrimack Valley, and the world in the name of Jesus Christ.
- St. Paul's helps create God's Kingdom on Earth. The Kingdom is not just the place you go when you die, but begins here on earth. While its fulfillment is only through the saving work of Jesus, we participate in that fulfillment as the Body of Christ today.

What is our purpose? What is our mission? It's pretty amazing, and now we all can articulate it. Many thanks to the Vestry for creating this statement. May St. Paul's, by the grace of God, have the courage and wisdom to fulfill it.

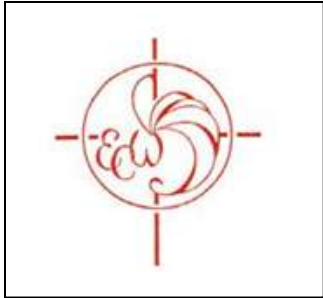

Finance Committee News

The revenue and expense for February and the first two months appear below. The disbursements for

February were about \$4,000 more than the income of the month. For the first two months of the year we are running a deficit of about (\$4,725). Please let Stephanie or the Finance Committee know of comments, questions.

Each month St. Paul's makes a payment to the Episcopal Diocese of Massachusetts to fund the mission of the Church in Massachusetts and the world. The total sent to the Diocese in 2010 will be \$19,366. If you would like to learn more about the budgeting process of the Diocese there will be a hearing held from 7 – 9 PM on Thursday, April 15th at Trinity Church, Topsfield. All are welcome.

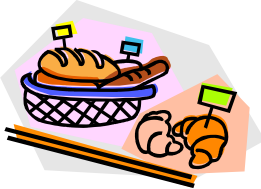

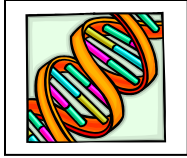
