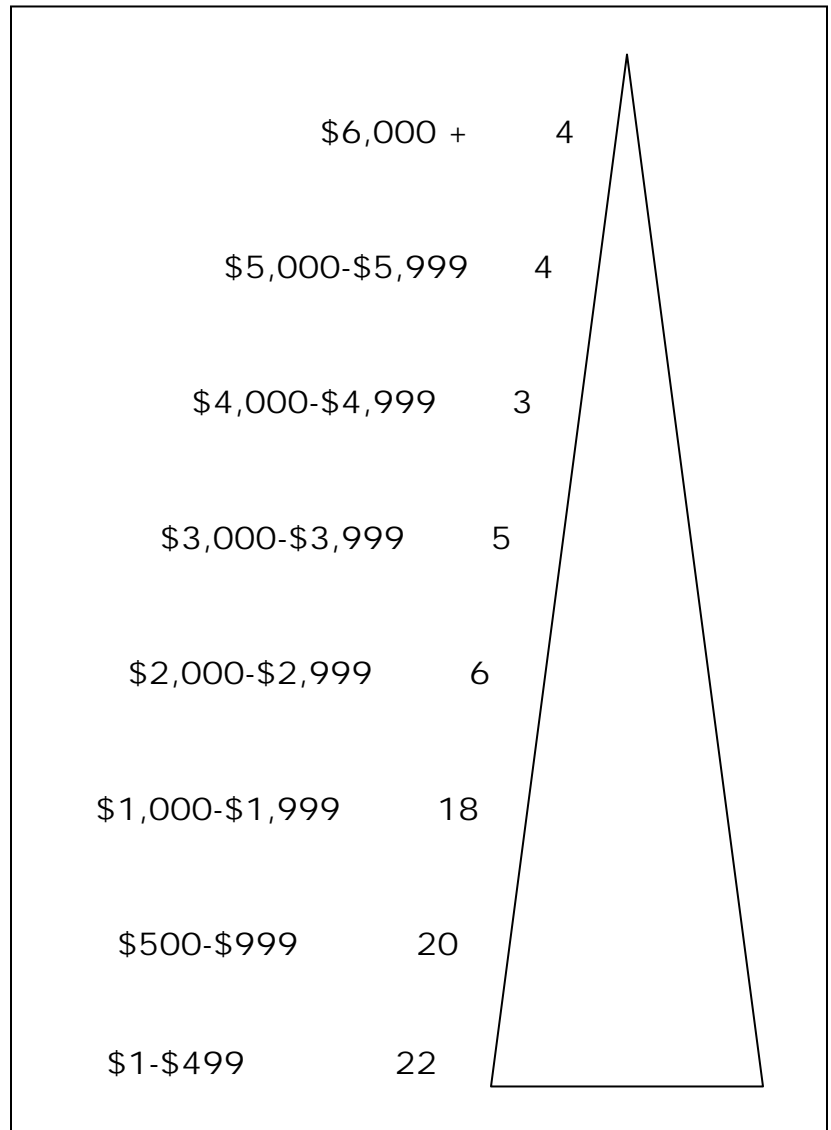

Money is a Spiritual Topic

There is no shame in talking about money at church. Jesus talked about money more than any other subject other than the Kingdom of God. You can't talk about God without talking about money.

"He sat down opposite the treasury, and watched the crowd putting money into the treasury. Many rich people put in large sums. A poor widow came and put in two small copper coins, which are worth a penny. Then he called his disciples and said to them, 'Truly I tell you, this poor widow has put in more than all those who are contributing to the treasury. For all of them have contributed out of their abundance; but she out of her poverty has put in everything she had, all she had to live on.'" (Mk 12:41-44)

Giving to the church is not about how much you give, but what proportion you give. 10% is the Biblical norm. The widow was exceedingly generous. Yet whatever you give is a blessing to both you and God's mission. Giving is a joy. It releases us from a dependence on money and allows us to trust in God. – Stephanie +

St. Paul's Women's Book Group

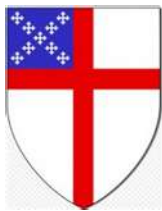

Diocesan Convention Forum at St. Paul's

In preparation for Diocesan Convention, St. Paul's will hold a pre-convention forum on Tuesday, October 20th 7-9 p.m. This will give

Episcopalians in this part of the Diocese a chance to discuss the resolutions and issues of Convention ahead of time.

Bob Zimmerman Proposes a Resolution for Diocesan Convention

As many of you are aware, the Episcopal General Convention (the National Church) voted to affirm a resolution this summer which read, "Resolved, that bishops, particularly those in dioceses within civil jurisdictions where same-gender marriage, civil unions, or domestic partnerships are legal, may provide generous pastoral response to meet the needs of members of this Church."

The words "generous pastoral response" were not defined. In an effort to begin to define them our own Bob Zimmerman proposed a resolution for our Diocesan Convention (Massachusetts Episcopal Church) to be held which reads, "Resolved, that the 224th Convention of the Diocese of Massachusetts express its hope that its Bishop will interpret publicly "generous pastoral response" as expressed in Resolution C056, passed by the 76th General Convention to mean that clergy throughout the Diocese are permitted to sign marriage licenses and pronounce marriages for any couple that is legally eligible for marriage in the Commonwealth of Massachusetts." Our Diocesan Convention will be held November 6-7, 2009 in Boston.

Finance Committee News



The revenue and expense for August and the first eight months appear below. The report indicates that we disbursed \$20,920 in operating expenses while taking in \$8,176 in operating revenue during the month of August. For

the first eight months of the year we have paid out \$51,406 more than we received in revenue. A total of \$40,000 has been transferred from our investments account to help fund the excess disbursements.

August, like July, is a "slow" month for pledge receipts. With the return to the regular programs in the fall, the pledge payments will pick up. A special "thank you" to all of you who were able to remain current with your pledge payments through the summer. The expenses in August included a final payment for the repairs to the buildings begun in July as well as some significant ongoing expenses paid quarterly.

A special August addition to the fixed assets of the parish is the new kitchen stove. The purchase of the stove for \$2,000 is not included in any of the operating budget numbers reported on here. The funds for the stove were provided by the Episcopal Churchwomen of St. Paul's. Thank you, ECW! It is a wonderful addition.

Inreach – helping those in need within St. Paul's










Web Master –Are you good with computers? Could you spare a few minutes each week to keep our website up to date?

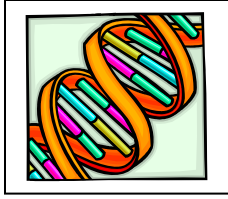
