## **What does it mean to be part of a Eucharistic community?**

*Connect?* is a six-week exploration of what it can mean to connect to a Eucharistic community. 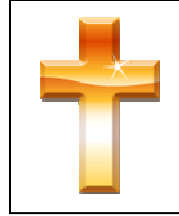

### **Other Community News:**

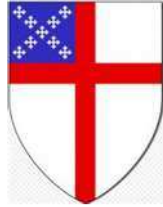

### Finance Committee News:

The revenue and expense for July and the first seven months appear below. The report indicates that we disbursed \$19,068 while taking in \$8,809 during the month of July. For the first seven months of the year we paid out \$38,662 more than we received in revenue. A total of \$30,000 has been transferred from our investments account to cover the excess disbursements.

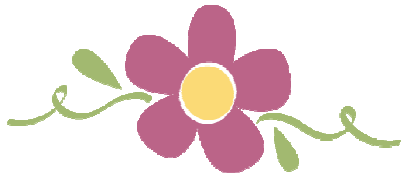
Summer months are often times of reduced pledge payments and the July receipts seem to reflect the same. During July some much needed repairs were made to maintain the integrity of the rectory and the sexton’s apartment. The combination of lower receipts and higher repairs made for the significant deficit.

The Finance Committee met during July to review receipts and disbursements through the first half of the year and projections for the year end. It is anticipated that there will be a deficit of (\$60,000) for the 12 months. The Vestry and Finance continue to consider ways of reducing this deficit.

## Oberammergau Passion Play 2010

I am exploring the possibility of a pilgrimage or trip of some sort for members of St. Paul's to make together. One possibility is the once-a-decade Oberammergau Passion play in Germany. The play was first performed in 1634 and is the result of a vow made by the inhabitants of this village that if God spared them from the effects of the black plague then sweeping the region they would perform a passion play every ten years. The play is now performed in years ending with a zero, and involves over 2000 actors, singers, instrumentalists and technicians, all residents of the village.

About half the inhabitants of Oberammergau will bring the story of Jesus of Nazareth to life for the audiences that flock in from around the world. The play starts with Jesus entering Jerusalem, continues with his death on the cross and finishes with the resurrection. As ever, this is an extraordinary community enterprise. The play starts at 14.30 and including a three-hour interval ends at 22.30, performances take place between mid-May and early October 2010.

Before I start organizing such a trip, I'd like to know if there is any interest in the congregation for such a journey. We could also visit some other religious sites in the area. Or perhaps we could visit another destination entirely, for instance Canterbury

in England. Please let me know. -
